- 1) Remotely controlled armed drones are increasingly being used by the world's militaries to launch attacks thousands of miles away. Some argue that being able to undertake air strikes without putting pilots in any danger is a good thing, while others argue that it makes it too easy for politicians to opt for war. Do you think the increasing use of armed drones makes the world more or less safe?
